04/15/2025 - A Rockland man was sentenced to prison today after pleading guilty to an armed bank robbery in Foxborough in 2022, Norfolk District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey announced.

Louis Paris, 49, was sentenced to a six- to eight-year prison term by Norfolk Superior Court Judge Michael Doolin. Paris pleaded guilty to one count of armed robbery while masked and two counts of assault by means of a dangerous weapon, District Attorney Morrissey said.

The charges are related to a robbery on September 13, 2022 at the Bank of America at 16 School Street on the Foxborough Town Common.

During the robbery at approximately 1:37 p.m., Paris wore a blue surgical mask and approached a teller who was engaged with a customer. He pointed a gun at them, forced the teller to place cash into a blue drawstring bag and fled the bank, according to Foxborough Police Chief Michael Grace.

Foxborough police obtained a video showing the getaway vehicle, a 2008 Mercury Mountaineer traced to the defendant. Paris was identified as a suspect through a bank security video and tips police received during the investigation, District Attorney Morrissey said.

Paris was arrested without incident about a week later at his apartment. Police recovered cash and 165 lottery tickets from his apartment and vehicle. District Attorney Morrissey said all but seven of the lottery tickets were determined to have been purchased on the day of the robbery.

“I want to recognize the efforts of Foxborough Police in identifying and apprehending this individual with the help of Rockland Police, the FBI and the Metro-LEC SWAT team,” District Attorney Morrissey said.

The District Attorney also praised Assistant District Attorneys Courtney Kiernan, Carolyn Hely and Tom Caldwell, who prosecuted the case, and Victim Witness Advocate Patricia Gallagher, who assisted the victims of the robbery through the court process.
