Sexual Assault, Children Impacted by Substances, Domestic Violence Support Partnership with Wayside Youth & Family Support Network

Franklin, MA - SAFE Coalition announced today that it is a partnering with Wayside Youth Services & Family Support Network's, to provide a new style of clinical support for sexual assault survivors, children impacted by substance use, and domestic violence. These clinical and informational supports provide direct care to victims and offer a new way for community members to receive clinical care.

"As COVID has impacted the environmental safety and recovery of our community members, these clinical resources allow for victims to receive the services in real time, in person, and in a confidential setting," said Jennifer Levine, Executive Director and co-founder of The SAFE Coalition. "We are so thankful for this partnership and for the federal programs that are allowing us to do this work completely free of charge".

Features and benefits include

- Sexual Assault Clinician – in person, by appointment, Friday 9am-5pm, free of charge, also provides legal advocacy
- Children Impacted by Substances – ongoing, in-person Friday 9am-5pm, free of charge
- Domestic Violence Cards – QR code given on business card with no language for discreteness, once scanned on a smart phone additional resources pop up

Availability

- Sexual Assault Clinical Support, will be available starting September 4, 2020.
- Children Impacted by Substance is currently available via telehealth. In-person starts 9/4/2020.
- Domestic Violence Cards will be available starting September 4, 2020

We focus on prevention, education, peer connection and treatment options.
