### Fatal shooting in Randolph

Randolph and Massachusetts State Police are investigating the homicide of a Boston man as he was sitting in his truck outside the Randolph apartment of a friend last night, according to Norfolk District Attorney Michael W. Morrissey.

Randolph Police received a 911 call at approximately midnight notifying them of gunshots heard in the vicinity of Highland Glen Drive and the Castle Village Condominiums. Responding officers located a pickup truck with evidence of bullet holes. Within the vehicle, they found 32-year old Deandre Jones suffering obvious injury. He was transported to the Good Samaritan Hospital where he was pronounced dead shortly after 1 a.m.

Randolph Police were joined in the investigation by members of the State Police detective unit attached to the Norfolk District Attorney's office, Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section, Firearms Identification Section, and Criminalistics.

The Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is expected to conduct an autopsy as early as today.

"Detectives were working through the night, collecting evidence and processing the scene. The vehicle was towed to the Randolph Police Station for forensic processing," District Attorney Morrissey said. "There have been no arrests and the investigation is ongoing."
