Five arrested in month-long heroin investigation

A month-long investigation involving Franklin Police Detectives, the State Police Drug Control Unit attached to the Norfolk DA's Office and the Drug Enforcement Agency's Heroin Enforcement Action Team (HEAT) resulted in the arrest of three men and two women – four from Franklin - on heroin, ammunition and other charges last week.

"We received information in April concerning a possible ongoing heroin distribution organization operating out of Franklin," District Attorney Michael Morrissey said. "Working with Franklin Police, that initial information became a larger investigation resulting in 5 arrests, 3 for drug distribution, recovery of ammunition suited for two different firearms, and items associated with the distribution of narcotics."

The arrests resulted from the execution of multiple search warrants of suspect residences.

Nathan A. Freeman, 36, of Dale St., Franklin pled not guilty to Possession with intent to distribute a class A drug (Heroin); Possession with intent to distribute a class D drug (Marijuana) and Possession to distribute a class A drug (Suboxone) at his arraignment in the Wrentham District Court on May 11, 2015.

Freeman, who was indicted April 29, 2015 on different heroin and marijuana distribution charges, had his bail revoked on the earlier case and was ordered held without bail for 90 days. The court imposed an additional \$100,000 cash bail on the new charges for when the 90 day revocation order expires. He was ordered to return for a probable cause hearing on June 10, 2015. He is due to be arraigned June 3 in Norfolk Superior Court on his April indictments.

Krisit L. Boggins, 22, of Lincoln Street, was arrested by Franklin Police after the execution of a search warrant at her residence. She pled not guilty to one count of Possession to Distribute a class A drug (Heroin) and possession of a class C drug (Klonopin). She was committed for substance abuse treatment on the motion of her defense attorney and is due back June 2, 2015 for pre-trial conference.

Execution of a search warrant by Franklin Police and mutual-aid officers associated with the Metropolitan Law Enforcement Council (METRO-LEC) at a residence on Flynn Road resulted in the arrest of Francesca A. Cardino, 22 of Brandywine Rd., Franklin, on a single count of being present where heroin is kept (Chap. 94C Sec. 35) and the arrest of property resident Christopher Spinazola, 20, on charges of possession of class A (heroin) class B (Suboxone), class E (Seoquel) and class E (Citalopram) drugs. Both pled not guilty. Scardino was released on personal recognizance, Spinazola posted \$250 cash bail, and both were ordered to return July 14, 2015 for pre-trial conference.

Anthony Reyes, 35, of Arrowhead Ln, Dedham, was arrested following the execution of a search warrant at 30 East Park Street, Franklin, on May 8. He pled not guilty to possession of a class E drug (Alprazolam), Possession of a class C drug (Clonazepam) and two counts of possessing ammunition without a valid firearm identification card. He was ordered held on probation violation and \$400 cash bail was imposed on the new charges. He was ordered to return June 9 for pre-trial conference.

"We are working across the local, state and federal levels to stop the heroin epidemic that is ruining and ending lives across Massachusetts. Alongside our work to prevent addictions and help addicts into recovery, we cannot relent in disrupting the supply of these drugs into our communities with vigorous enforcement," District Attorney Morrissey said. "We could not have asked for more productive and professional partners than Franklin detectives and the DEA HEAT team."
